Since being launched in 2012, the JMarts Scholars program has awarded 89 scholarships to 60 students for intensive study over the summer, usually at weeklong, residential workshops offered on university campuses.

JMarts Scholars develop their talent, explore artistic options before making their college decisions and bring what they learn back to share with other Jordan-Matthews students.

Scholarships are funded by individual contributions to the foundation, community fundraisers and ticket sales for the musical and major concerts during the academic year. Last year, music scholarships were presented with generous funding from the Fearrington Village Singers and one theater scholarship from the JM PTA in memory of JM science teacher Mike Williams.

A SEASON OF FROZEN



Only one school in each state was selected in a national competition to receive free rights and support to produce the Broadway musical's first-ever high school performances.

It won't be long until "Let It Go" rings from the JM stage! The first-ever North Carolina high school production of "Frozen: The Broadway Musical" comes to Siler City this spring with three performances on April 19-21.

Based on the hit 2013 animated feature film, Disney's stage adaptation of "Frozen" opened on Broadway in March 2018.

When Arendelle princess young Elsa accidentally injures her sister Anna, it causes a chain of tragic events throughout their childhood. And when Elsa brings permanent winter to Arendelle during her coronation, she flees to an ice-bound mountain. But Anna and her friends Kristoff, Olaf and Sven journey to save Elsa, and the kingdom, by bringing back summer. Frozen celebrates the many forms of true love, especially the bond between

sisters.

JM was selected to present the North Carolina high school premiere of "Frozen: The Broadway Musical" in a nationwide competition sponsored by Educational Theatre Association, Disney Theatrical Group and Music Theatre International. Centering on the theme, "Love Is An Open Door," the competition was designed to promote inclusion and outreach in high school theatre programs.

Applicants were asked to demonstrate how they will use their production of "Frozen" to strengthen their school communities, provide outreach to underserved groups and support inclusive and diverse theatre programs.
